A Message From Mr Pope

Dear Parents & Carers,

The second part of Autumn is a very busy time of year. Having had parliament week the school immediately moved into anti-bullying week raising awareness with odd sock day. Thank you so much to the parents who also supported us – the children and adults enjoyed seeing that anti – bullying is so important for everyone. Each half term the school tracks, monitors and reviews the statistics relating to behaviour. Behaviour at Newton Poppleford is extremely good and very often exemplary. We have so much to celebrate with our children all the time from the way they show their enthusiasm for learning, how they behave towards one another to how they speak and interact with adults. A recent arranged visit from our school development partner led to the following comment and feedback

"Newton Poppleford children are polite and articulate. They demonstrate happiness at school and a real desire to learn."

Well done to our children once again! We are always looking to improve and we will be carrying out further antibullying work across the year including some pupil voice activities to find out what our children think we can do to get even better.

The children spoke to their local MP and each class gave 2 questions (these came from the children and were voted on in class) such as: Can you plant more trees and plants (year 1), How do you help the poor? (Year 2) and culminating in more challenging questions from year 6, What should happen if MP's lie in parliament? Each class received feedback and the answers to their questions form their chosen representatives. It was a valuable experience for all the children and a great way to end our parliament week.

Positive Noticing Day was a great way to spend some time for all the children and adults. In our school, we make reference to positivity as one of our key characteristics. These characteristics are not just for children and is something that we as adults hold very strongly in our collective values. It is so important for children to be positive, have a growth mindset and strive to reach their full potential. The day was amazing and we noticed so many lovely behaviours, attitudes and qualities on the day. We of course see these things day in day out but to be able to raise the awareness and bring those to the fore for everyone was of great benefit.

My thanks go to Hannah our dance teacher for the dance workshops that were delivered this week. The children thoroughly enjoyed performing and learning their West-end dance routines. I hope that you all enjoyed hearing about the days that the children spent practising and performing. Last newsletter, I wrote about reading. Another key aspect we are constantly looking at in school is our maths provision. Below you will find the link to the home learning videos that we refer to in your child's curriculum overviews. Important Information

SEND: Attachment based mentoring. Currently two of our staff team are undergoing training in ABM. This will be of great benefit to our entire school community:

AMB is a relational approach to supporting children with their social and emotional development. The approach includes both universal and targeted support, particularly for children who may have had adverse childhood experiences, those who are struggling with their emotional health and well being and those who are finding it difficult to engage with learning and social aspects of school. Developed from the ground, it looks at specific needs of these children and how these can be met through our relationships, what we are doing and how we are being with the child.




Parent Drop-In Session
