

As always, we want you to know and be aware of what pupils in the school are learning and what we are Next term our focus will be on retrieval practice and how we encourage pupils to "know more, and remember more." This is based on research around the Ebbinghaus forgetting curve. In classrooms this is made a reality through activities and games that help children to do this - you may find children talking mo

The idea behind this is very much common sense.

Put simply:

The pupils will remember more of the information they have learnt if they revisit it at regular periods. By recalling and revisiting the information they reinforce it in their long term memory.
